

- ① Every Monday at 9 am, Kamlesh Ratnu leaves the vibrant blue city of Jodhpur on his motorbike and heads east to the rural village of Chandelao in Rajasthan, India. Each week, he works behind a set of heavy wooden doors that open onto a courtyard lined with low red sandstone buildings and a traditional thatched hut. The square is adorned with clouds of pink bougainvillea, henna, frangipani and West Indian jasmine, creating a picturesque setting for the workshop – ‘Sunder Rang’. Founded in 2007, this non-profit crafts collective has become an economic lifeline for local artisan women. Forty-year-old Kamlesh has worked for the organisation for more than a decade as a fashion designer and manager. "I've always been drawn to fashion, especially festive Indian wear," he says. "I saw a famous Indian fashion designer's interview when I was a teenager, and I instantly knew that fashion was my calling."
- ⑤ Before joining Sunder Rang, Kamlesh taught pattern making, garment construction, portfolio and design collection at the International Institute of Fashion Design in Jodhpur. Teaching these young artisans led him towards Sunder Rang, which has community development at the heart of its altruistic ethos.

The crafts collective (Sunder Rang) was founded by local businessman Praduman Singh and Norwegian entrepreneur Kristin G Andersen, with an aim to uplift the local community, empower artisans and

- ⑮ **preserve** the art of traditional Rajasthani handicrafts. Today, the organisation employs around 35 women from the local village, providing **them** with a stable income and fair wages. Any additional profit is used to expand the project and support the wider community in areas of development, sanitation and education.

Sunder Rang's products come in a bright palette of colours and range from tote bags to pouches, cushion covers, bed linens, beaded jewellery and block-printed kurtas (traditional tunics). "The artisans blend

- ⑳ traditional designs with a contemporary twist in every creation," Kamlesh explains.

One of the many techniques used at Sunder Rang is block printing - an ancient Rajasthani art that uses hand-carved wood blocks on fabric dyed with natural colours, derived from the likes of turmeric and pomegranate. It's a time-consuming process requiring a lot of skill and can be seen on a variety of Sunder Rang's products, including tiered dresses, voluminous weekend bags and habutai silk scarves.

- ㉕ Another popular design technique is gudri work - a vibrant hand-embroidered method that uses a continuous running stitch. "Gudri in Rajasthan is essentially a style of bedding, made by using old, discarded clothes. We patch and layer them on, and then sew them together using the running stitches," Kamlesh states proudly.
